The successful candidate will have a Ph.D. in geography, statistics, planning, sociology or a closely related field as well as the potential or demonstrated ability to conduct independent quantitative research in geodemographics, and possess familiarity with US Census and related datasets. Candidates with experience in geocomputation and Python are highly desired. Candidates with the potential or demonstrated ability to work within and contribute to a diverse campus environment are strongly encouraged to apply. The initial appointment will be for two years with the opportunity to extend the appointment for an additional two years, pending positive performance reviews and the availability of funding. The position is available starting January 1, 2018 and applications will be considered until the position is filled.
